



Erigmore Disability Access Statement

Erigmore Leisure Park welcomes people with disabilities and has developed this Access Statement to address some of the common issues which disabled people may face. We are a pet friendly park and guide dogs are permitted throughout.

We aim to ensure that all employees, guests and others who use the park and its facilities are treated equally and according to their needs.

Pre-arrival

For any help or assistance prior to arrival, we advise contacting our Reception or Holiday Sales team.

Reception and complex entrance

There is a parking area directly outside the Reception/Sales/Complex/Pool entrances. The car park and path to the building is flat and there is both a step and a ramp leading up to Reception and the Bar and Restaurant. There is a short walk round to the Pool which also has a step and a ramp to enter. There is a step to access the Sales and General Manager's office.

Movement around the Reception and Bar & Lounge is all on one level, however access to the conservatory is via steps. There is an alternative route via the path to the Pool.

The swimming pool does not have a hoist facility but there is level access into the building. There are no disabled changing rooms but the family changing room can be used and is easily accessible.

Public areas

Access to the park is up a steep, winding road and this continues throughout the majority of the park with dips and peaks into various areas of the park. Some internal roads on the park are tarmac, however some are gravel and shingle.

The launderette on park has a small step up.

Accommodation

There are no designated accessible caravans on the park and all caravans come with 3 steps leading up to the accommodation. The lodges have a varying degree of steps ranging from 2 standard steps to steps with a wrap walk way. No accommodation has ramps. Both apartments, Atholl and Wallace, are accessed through the main Reception door and there is a staircase to access both apartments.

The Factors Cottage has one concrete step leading in, however there is a small concrete ramp to access the rear door that could be used.

Local area

The local village of Birnam is a short walk, either via a short cut from the park (approx. 10 minutes however this is via a steep slope) or back towards the park entrance (down the steep entrance road) which then flattens out to walk in to the village centre which takes slightly longer, perhaps 20 minutes. Birnam has a newsagent, petrol station, pub and restaurant. From Birnam you can also walk to Dunkeld which is relatively flat, with the exception of the small hump over the bridge, where you will find a larger selection of pubs, bars, restaurants, shops and a Co-op supermarket. There is a bus stop in the village of Birnam which would take you around the surrounding areas, to Perth etc.
